iOS SIG Meeting • July 16, 2013

This month at the iOS SIG, we looked at apps that make traveling more enjoyable, from researching your destination to helping you get around. We walked through some of the features of airplane and hotel booking apps such as Kayak and Skyscanner. Each emphasizes something a little different but they all report similar prices for the same flights. I also mentioned SeatGuru which shows the seat layout of the plane for a particular flight so you can avoid a less than desirable seat.

We looked at several GPS apps such as Navigon, Maps, and Google Maps. Since the meeting, Google Maps was updated with the ability to download maps by typing in the phrase 'ok maps' into the search bar and search for it. Google Maps will automatically download all the map data that's currently on the screen of your device. Google Maps has also become a universal app.

I demonstrated the Vienna edition of mTrip. mTrip has a list of the many sights, attractions, restaurants, and shops for the specific city. It will create an itinerary for the time and the interests you indicate. For example, it will list and order attractions in groups that are easily reachable by walking or however you are getting around. It is easily changed and places removed or added, but it creates a nice plan to start with for sightseeing.

We also looked at World Clock, iTranslate, FlightTracker Pro, FlightRadar, and WorldMate.

Q&A SIG Meeting • July 8, 2013

On July 8, 2013, the Question and Answer Special Interest Group (Q&A SIG) met once again at Woodbury's TEAM Technology store. Thanks to our hosts, Dave Schroeder and John

O'Brien-Schroeder, for providing a comfortable environment and much pertinent information. TEAM is offering special pricing on Time Capsules and Airport Extreme base stations while supplies last. See their web site (<http://teamteks.com>) for more details.

In answer to a question asked last month at PieSIG, Tim Tierney made a presentation on Evernote. Evernote is an application available on Mac OS X and iOS that stores your data in the cloud so it is available to all your electronics. Tim told us how he started using Evernote to capture and save notes, reminders, audio, and graphics. Data is organized into a set of stacks and notebooks; a basic account comes with 60 MB of free on-line storage with additional storage and transfer capability available with a Premium account. Evernote has an optical character reader (OCR) capability so that you can search even within graphics to help find that bit of data you need. Evernote also has an add-on application called Skitch with the capability to mark up PDFs in ways that Preview cannot.

A user was having problems losing bookmarks on their iPad; the user bookmarked items of interest in Safari only to have the bookmarks disappear. It turned out the user was not setting the folder properly when saving the bookmark so it was being stored in a different folder than anticipated. Once the folder was being set properly before the bookmark was stored, everything started working as expected.

Someone asked about their iPad not going to sleep when they close the cover and about the iPad battery losing its charge overnight. It was suggested the no-sleep problem is caused by misalignment between the magnetic closures on the cover and the sensors on the iPad; the problem should be eliminated with a careful positioning of the cover when it is closed. The battery charge problem may be helped by disabling wi-fi and Bluetooth when they aren't

being actively used and by reducing the brightness of the display to the lowest acceptable level. Battery life might also be extended by closing apps that are not being used (double-click on the Home button to see what is open and close all apps not currently needed). If iOS gets hung up, hold the Home and Power buttons simultaneously to Restart the hardware.

Someone wondered about software to edit audio files. Audacity was suggested as one alternative. It was suggested that other alternatives might be found by locating the Audacity page on MacUpdate and looking to

see if other MacUpdate users have suggested any similar software. Another suggestion was to go to the Open Source Alternative website (osalt.com) and search for alternatives there. The next Q&A SIG meeting is at the Wentworth Library (199 Wentworth Avenue East) in West St. Paul on August 12. We will be using the small meeting room near the back of the library. Our meeting starts at 6:30 pm and lasts until about 8:15 pm (the library closes at 8:30 pm). PieSIG meets at the Bakers Square Restaurant on South Robert Street, one long block south of Marie Avenue.
